# RESEARCH EXPERIENCE AND INTERESTS



Doctor James Llinas is an Emeritus Professor in the Departments of Industrial and Systems Engineering and dual-appointed in the Department of Mechanical and Aerospace Engineering at the State University of New York

at Buffalo, in Buffalo, New York, USA. He is the Founder and Executive Director of the Center for Multisource Information Fusion, the only systemsoriented academic research center for Information Fusion in the United States; the Center has been in existence for some 20+ years and has conducted extensive and distinctive research for a wide variety of governmental and civilian clients. Dr. Llinas brings over 35 years of experience in multisource information processing and data fusion technology to his research, teaching, and business development activities. He is an internationally-recognized expert in sensor, data, and information fusion, co-authored the first integrated book on Multisensor Data Fusion, and has lectured internationally for over 30 years on this topic. He is a recipient of the Joe Mignona Award given to one person annually by the US Data Fusion Group for lifetime achievements in Data Fusion. In 1998, as the International Society for Information Fusion was being developed, he was voted as the First President of the Society. He has been a consultant and advisor to U.S., Canadian, Australian, Norwegian, Swedish, and Spanish Ministries of Defense. In addition to the original book, Dr. Llinas is also the co-editor of the "Handbook of Multisensor Data Fusion" published in 2001, a second edition in 2009, and of a new Handbook of Distributed Multisensor Data Fusion published in 2012, as well as a recent text on Context-enhanced Information Fusion published in 2016.

#### **ELISA SHAHBAZIAN**

OODA Technologies, Canada



Dr. ELISA SHAHBAZIAN is the President and co-founder of OODA Technologies Inc., a Montreal based Research and Development (R&D) company established in August 2008, specializing in decision support technologies and applications

in defence, aerospace and finance. She has been involved in R&D in data/information fusion since 1991 initially for the development of fusion capability onboard the Canadian frigates and subsequently in higher level fusion enabled decision support to establish situational awareness.

Dr. Shahbazian received her PhD degree in High Energy Physics from McGill University in 1983. Since 1982, while still completing the Ph.D. program, she started working in the software engineering industry. She worked with Philips (1984-1985), INFOMART (1982-1984) and Lockheed Martin Canada (LM Canada) (1985-2008), where she performed on and managed various Software Engineering and R&D activities.

In 1991 Dr. Shahbazian established the data/ Information group at LM Canada and between 1991-2008 she performed on and lead all research in fusion and decision support in the company. With her leadership the LM Canada R&D department became a fusion centre of excellence in Canada, collaborating with other research groups, academia and internationally. She has 8 edited volumes and over 70 articles and reports. She has been a member of ISIF since 1998. She was elected to the ISIF board in 2001, was on the Executive Committee since 2003-2013 and was elected as the president in 2009. She was the director of the organizing committee for Fusion 2001 conference in Montreal as well has participated as a member of technical committee and chaired sessions in most ISIF and EuroFusion conferences since 1998.

Dr. Shahbazian has been very active in promoting Data/Information Fusion internationally. She participated in NATO Industry Advisory Group (NIAG), NATO Research and Technology Agency (RTA) and Research and Technology Organisation (RTO) meetings and has organized and co-organizing a number of NATO Advanced Study Institutes (ASI) and Advanced Research Workshops (ARW) www.canadianatomeetings.com.

2002-2011 she was elected to be on the board of directors as well as a member of the Research Management Committee for Mathematics of Information Technology and Complex Systems (MITACS).

Since 1994 Dr. Shahbazian is also an associate member of the Centre de recherche Mathematiques (CRM) at the Université de Montréal.

#### **ROY STREIT**

Dr. Streit is a Senior Research Scientist at Metron in Reston, Virginia, and Professor (Adjunct) of Electrical and Computer Engineering, University of Massachusetts-Dartmouth. He is a Fellow of the IEEE. He is on the Board of

Governors of the IEEE Aerospace and Electronics Society (2016-18). He was President of the International Society for Information Fusion (ISIF) in 2012 and continues to serve on its Board of Directors. He is the founding Editor-in-Chief of the ISIF Perspectives Magazine.

Dr. Streit's research interests include multitarget tracking, multi-sensor data fusion, medical imaging, signal processing, quantum computing, business analytics, and pharmacovigilance. He is the author of the book Poisson Point Processes, Springer, 2010 (Chinese translation, 2013) and co-author of Bayesian Multiple Target Tracking, 2nd Edition, Artech, 2014. He has published numerous technical papers and invited papers at international conferences, and holds nine U.S. patents.

Before 2005, Dr. Streit was in the Senior Executive Service at the Naval Undersea Warfare Center in Newport, Rl. He was awarded the Navy Superior Civilian Achievement Award and the American Society of Naval Engineers Solberg Award. He was an Exchange Scientist, DSTO, Adelaide, Australia, 1987–89; Visiting Scientist, Yale University, 1982–84; and Visiting Scholar, Stanford University, 1981–82. He received his Ph.D. in Mathematics from the University of Rhode Island.

NATO CMRE, Italy





the Boards of Director of the International Society of Information Fusion (ISIF) where she serves as VP membership, and of the Boards of Director and steering committee of the Belief Functions and Applications Society (BFAS). She serves on program committees of the FUSION and BELIEF conferences. She co-organized the Information Fusion conference in Quebec City in 2007 (Tutorial Chair) and served on the organizing committee of Fusion 2015 in Washington (International Co-chair). She is associate editor of the Perspectives on Information Fusion magazine. She has been adjunct professor at Laval University (Quebec, Canada) during 10 years. Her current research interests include maritime anomaly detection, high-level and hard & soft information fusion, reasoning under uncertainty, information quality assessment and assessment of uncertainty representation and reasoning techniques.

#### **HENRY LEUNG**

University of Calgary, Canada



Henry Leung is a professor of the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering of the University of Calgary. Before joining U of C, he was with the Department of National Defence (DND) of Canada as a defence scientist. His main duty

there was to conduct research and development of automated surveillance systems, which can perform detection, tracking, identification and data fusion automatically as a decision aid for military operators. His current research interests include adaptive systems, information fusion, robotics, sensor networks, signal processing and wireless communications. He has published extensively in the open literature on these topics. He has over 200 journal papers and 180 refereed conference papers. Dr. Leung has been the associate editor of various journals such as the IEEE Circuits and Systems Magazine, International Journal on Information Fusion, IEEE Signal Processing Letters, IEEE Trans. Circuits and Systems. He has also served as guest editors for the special issue "Intelligent Transportation Systems" for the International Journal on Information Fusion and "Cognitive Sensor Networks" for the IEEE Sensor Journal. He is a fellow of the IEEE. Dr. Leung was the Special Sessions Chair for the Fusion 2007 in Quebec City.

#### THIA KIRUBARAJAN

McMaster University, Canada



Dr Thia Kirubarajan (Kiruba) received the B.A. and M.A. degrees in electrical and information engineering from Cambridge University, England, and the M.S. and Ph.D. degrees in electrical engineering from the University

of Connecticut, Storrs. Dr Kirubarajan holds the title of Distinguished Engineering Professor and holds the Canada Research Chair in Information Fusion at McMaster University, Canada. He has published about 125 journal papers, 250 conference articles, 11 book chapters, one standard textbook on target tracking and four edited volumes. He has lead multiple projects on tracking and fusion with support from the Canadian Department of National Defense, US Air Force, US Navy, NASA, NSERC, Ontario Ministry of Research and Innovation, General Dynamics Canada, Raytheon Canada, ComDev/exactEarth, Toyota, Mine Radio Systems, Qualtech, FLIR Radar Systems and Lockheed Martin Canada. In addition to conducting research, he has worked extensively with government labs and companies to process real data and to transition his research to the real world. Through his company TrackGen (www.trackgen.com), he has developed a number of software programs, including MultiTrack for real-time large-scale multisensor-multitarget tracking, MultiFuse for distributed tracking, SceneGen for surveillane scenario simulation, and ISR360 for visualization, performance analysis and situation awareness, which have been integrated into many fielded systems. He is a recipient of Ontario Premier's Research Excellence Award and IEEE AESS Barry Carlton Award. He was the co-Technical Program Chair for Fusion 2002 and co-Awards Chair for Fusion 2014.

# RISK AND SURPLUS

The registration fees are at least 30% lower than the ones from the most of the past conferences (see table below), based on the actual currency exchange rate (EUR/CAD:1.44 or USD/CAD:1.28). (Exchange Rate: based on rate of exchange June 24, 2016.)

It is highly improbable to see the Canadian dollar equal or become stronger than the USD and EUR before 2019. In the improbable situation when the Canadian dollar will be exchanged at parity with the USD and EUR in 2019, the registration fees will just become similar to the ones of the other past conferences.

A surplus is expected in all proposed scenarios. If the number of attendees increases, it is expected that the surplus will increase too.

At this moment we had obtained some quotation for the costs of the venue, catering, banquet and welcome reception (see quotes attached).

After the final decision, we will be able to secure the quotes obtained for all these events and/or will be able to work with our partners to obtain better quotes for similar services. This could increase the surplus, without needing to increase the registration fees.

Even based on the low proposed registration fees, estimated costs and number of attendees, it is highly improbable that there will be a loss for ISIF in organizing this conference in Ottawa. Based on the following risks:

- Canadian dollar exchange rate (w.r.t. USD and EUR)
- number of attendees below the average/the expectation
- increasing costs for expected services (catering, insurance, banquet and reception, etc)

The FUSION 2019 Organizing Committee could modulate the registration fees (but still keep them under the ones of the 2015, 2016 conferences) to cover unexpected costs, increase the surplus (based on the ISIF expectations) or provide more services to the participants.

Several major and small industrial potential sponsors will be approached by the Organizing Committee to obtain sponsorship for the event. IEEE and other Canadian Government research organizations that promote innovative research collaborations at Industries and Industry-Academia partnerships, such as Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council (NSERC), National Research Council (NRC) and Mitacs Canada could also contribute to sponsor the FUSION 2019 event, in case the expected budget is different from the real needed budget.

# **CONFERENCE SIZE ESTIMATE**

Based on the previous conferences (2007 - 2018), we are conservatively estimating the number of attendees for the FUSION 2019 in Ottawa to 400. The last FUSION conference was held in Canada (Quebec City - 2007) had a large participation from the fusion community, showing that Canada is an interesting choice for organizing such a conference. Ottawa is an easy to get to location with a choice of excellent 5 star venues and at the same time less expensive than most other cities in North America and Europe.

The number of attendees at the FUSION conference was between 350 and 450 within the last 10 years and it is reasonable to believe that the FUSION 2019 in Ottawa, Canada will attract at least an average number of 400 attendees. From this number, we expect 250 regular attendees (industry, government, and academia) and 150 student attendees.

Research in the Information Fusion domain in Canada by major players: Lockheed Martin, Thales Group, Raytheon, General Dynamics, MDA, Defence Research & Development Canada (DRDC-RDDC). We can expect a large participation from all these organisations for the FUSION 2019 conference to be held in Ottawa.

Traveling to Canada is easier than traveling to USA (from a travel authorisation point of view). The list of countries exempt of visa requirements is longer for Canada than for the USA. This could increase or facilitate participation to the conference.

Ottawa is centrally-located in the province of Ontario, with the Ottawa International Airport offering daily direct connections to over 30 Canadian, U.S. and European Centres. The airport is a modern, efficient facility that has won numerous international awards for service quality. Commute time from the airport to downtown Ottawa is under 20 minutes, and can include a scenic drive along the Rideau Canal.

VIA Rail Canada serves the Capital with regular daily service to Toronto and Montreal, as well as parts of southern Ontario.

#### TRANSPORTATION COSTS

Since the venues are all within easy walking distance, transportation on site will not be necessary. The only costs for transportation will be the flights to and from Ottawa, and the transfer to their downtown Ottawa hotel (approximately \$40 CDN taxi ride).

# PUBLICITY PLANS

To attract a large number of attendees from academia and industry, we will start disseminate the information 15-18 months before the event (starting in the beginning of 2018, even before the FUSION 2018 to be held in Cambridge, UK).

The first step will be to setup the conference website as soon as possible. Once a web site has been established, in addition to a number of advertisement activities that have been successful in previous ISIF conferences, the Canadian organizing committee will leverage their established relationships with the Canadian Government research organizations that promote innovative research collaborations at Industries and Industry-Academia partnerships, such as Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council (NSERC), National Research Council (NRC) and Mitacs Canada to enable largest number of young graduate and postgraduate researchers obtain financial support to participate at the ISIF2019.

Other publicity activities will include:

- 1. Distribution of hardcopies of call-for-papers, posters, brochures starting in January 2018, at different events.
- 2. Advertisement campaign during Fusion 2018 to reach the core audience for this conference.
- Advertisement campaign through mailing lists, IEEE specialized branches (local and internationals), academia, Social Media (LinkedIn, Corporate Social Media Tools, etc)
- 4. Advertisement through sponsors
- 5. Advertisement through Ottawa Tourism Office.

The Publicity Chair and the International Liaisons Chair will be in charge of the strategy on identifying the key conferences that have similar topics and attendees that could be interested by the FUSION 2019 conference. They will also identify key members from the FUSION 2019 Organizing Committee (or other ISIF key members) that could disseminate the information about the FUSION 2019 conference during 2018 events. Finally, the Publicity Chair will gather and manage the lists of past and potential attendees for advertisement campaigns.



# **CONFERENCE DATES**

# **JULY 2 - 5, 2019**

The FUSION conferences have been usually held in the beginning of July, each year. The proposed dates for the FUSION 2019 to be held in Ottawa, Canada are: **July 2 - 5, 2019**—starting the day after Canada Day on July 1.

At these dates, there will be no date conflicts with other major conferences on the similar topics. Moreover, the average temperature in Ottawa in this period of the year will between 20 - 30 degrees Celsius with light probability of rain. This makes Ottawa one of the best locations for the FUSION Conference in North America.

# **Canada Day**

Ottawa, Canada's Capital, is the place to be July 1 for the country's biggest annual birthday celebration. It's a giant patriotic party on the lawns of Parliament Hill, Major's Hill Park, at the Canadian Museum of History and on the closed streets of downtown. The crowds start to gather on Parliament Hill early, for a 9 a.m. flag raising ceremony and the Changing of the Guard ceremony, which is followed by the carillon concert featuring the Peace Tower bells, at 10 a.m. Be there at noon for a thrilling performance by the Snowbirds Demonstration team, and a noon hour show filled with cultural entertainment. For families, the Canadian Museum of History will host a variety of activities especially for children ages 3 to 12 including games, physical activities, performances and inflatable slides. For revelers of all ages there will be free activities at most of the areaís national museums and institutions.

Excitement continues throughout the day at major sites and attractions downtown and across the Capital. The evening show on Parliament Hill features a stellar lineup of Canadian performers. And as always, the evening will be topped off by a giant fireworks show you simply don't want to miss!



# **LOCAL ACTIVITIES**

Summer is an excellent time to be in Canada's Capital. It's the season when the city's vast network of cycling and recreation paths are accessible, as are the many outdoor adventure experiences for which the Capital is renowned. It's also the time of year when tour boats ply the waters of the Rideau Canal and Ottawa River; when national museums present annual blockbuster special exhibitions; and when the city is alive with festivals and summer pageantry on Parliament Hill and much more! The opportunities for off-agenda activities are endless, from sightseeing and culture, to sports and recreation, to al fresco dining and outdoor cafés.

# **PARLIAMENT HILL**

The seat of Canada's federal government and the setting for national celebrations the year round, Parliament Hill is the most visited Ottawa attraction. 


# **LIABILITY**
