WELCOME TO LINKÖPING

Welcome to a city that makes you rich in feelings and experiences. There's plenty to see and do year round in Linköping: the open air museum Old Linköping, the city garden park, the cathedral dating back to the 1100's, canals and locks, one of the biggest oak tree landscapes in northern Europe to mention a few. If you want to enjoy nature or are more intersted in a city pulse you don't have to choose. Both are within reach. Linköping has a fabulous country side, lakes, canals as well as a rich culture, shopping and nightlife.

About 27 000 students attend Linköping University, LiU, where world-leading, boundary-crossing research in fields that include materials science, IT, advanced visualisation and hearing is conducted. In the same spirit, the university offers many innovative educational programmes, frequently with a clear professional focus and leading to qualification as, for example, doctors, teachers, economists and engineers. Linköping is coined the aviation capital of Sweden. The first flight academy in Sweden was founded here and this is where the only aircraft manufacturing plant, Saab, in Sweden is located. About 18 000 people of the city's population are employed in the aviation field.

Linköping is the 5th largest municipality in Sweden with 160 000 inhabitants. Linköping is big enough to have most things you'd expect to find in a city, small enough to have it within reach.

VENUE

We propose that the conference be held at Linköping Konsert & Kongress situated in the heart of the city next to the cathedral and castle. Plenary seating for 1200 and an additional 25 breakout rooms are available. The majority of hotels, restaurants and shopping is located within a 10 minute walk as is the bus and train station.

SWEDISH AIR FORCE MUSEUM

The Swedish Air Force Museum is a modern technical and cultural history museum tracing the development of Swedish military aviation. The museum has a unique collection of aircraft, from pioneers of the early 20th century to the present day JAS 39 Gripen. The crown jewel in the Swedish Air Force Museum's collections is the Swedish DC-3 that was shot down by a Soviet fighter aircraft over the Baltic Sea in 1952. After more than fifty years of speculation, the wreck was found at the bottom of the sea, salvaged and laid to rest in the museum.

GALA DINNER

We suggest that the gala dinner be held at the Swedish air force museum. Here up to 600 guests are comfortably seated among the air craft. Start the evening with a guided tour and make the museum come to life. Dinner will be prepared with locally grown ingredients and flavours that will not dissapoint. Stage and entertainment can be brought in should the decision be to stay here for the entire evening.

5 KM RUN

Linköping is home to a network of walking and running tails. A suggestion is that the conference morning run will be from the city center in a loop along the canal. What a great way to start the day!

WIF

Linköping municipality offers free WiFi in the city center, Linkoping WiFi, as well as at the conference venue. The same access points also hosts Eduroam serving all the academic researchers just as being on their home campus. https://www.eduroam.org/where/



WHY SWEDEN and WHY LINKÖPING?

Sweden is the by far most well represented country at the Fusion conferences, counted in the number of publications and participants per capita. Fusion has only been held in Sweden once before, in Stockholm 2004. In Sweden, Linköping is the dominating city at the Fusion conference, and in the fusion area. We can mention the following organizations:

Linköping University. Among other things, LiU has a leading role in the Wallenberg Program on AI and Autonomous Systems, with a funding of 300 million USD 2016-2026

FOI, the Swedish Defence Research Agency, which organized Fusion 2004, and historically has many collaborations with other organizations active in Fusion. The Linköping branch (C4ISR) has 300 employees at the department of defence.


SAAB (Aerospace, Dynamics, Combitech) with about 5000 employees is developing target tracking and navigation solutions for aerospace applications, among others. Their main product is the fighter aircraft Gripen, exported to some half dozen countries.

Veoneer (formerly Autoliv) is growing quickly with today 520 engineers developing automotive safety systems based on cameras and radar. Their collision warning and avoidance systems are found in many high-end cars.

WASP (Wallenberg AI, Autonomous Systems and Software Program) is the largest research program in Sweden ever. The total budget is now exceeding 3 billion SEK, after that the Wallenberg foundation granted another billion for AI research related to autonomous systems. The total program will generate 300 PhD. The interesting part is that almost all students will be active 2021 (last year for the first batch, first year of the last batch). Fusion should be a relevant conference for a large number of students, and their hundreds of supervisors. We plan to include relevant Tutorials and Special Sessions around autonomous systems and machine learning to attract as many WASP researchers as possible.

KOLMARDEN The proposed ISIF working group LoL (Life on Land, UN Sustainable Development Goal #15) is focusing on multi-target multisensor wildlife monitoring, a theme that will be timely introduced at Fusion 2020 in South Africa. As part of this initiative, a tutorial thematic day is planned for the Monday preceding the conference at Kolmården Zoo. LiU is here building up a research test site, where sensor networks and drones survey animals, vehicles, park rangers and visitors in the park. This tutorial day includes both theory and practice.

JULY July is a great month to visit Linköping. The weather tends to be beautiful, the city is in full bloom and lively with outdoor cafés, restaurants and people on vacation. Prices are typically lower then most of the other months of the year making it very affordable to conference. Well picked!





FOUNDING TEAM

The founding team (Fredrik Gustafsson, Gustaf Hendeby, Jenny Irwin) started the planning process already in February 2017. For various reasons, they focused on a smaller conference in 2017 (IEEE sponsored RED-UAS), which was held in Linköping in October 2017. The program, conference site and dinner were all according to the current proposal. This means that the team has already performed a conference on a smaller scale, taking on all the roles in the organisation committee themselves. Further, both Jenny and Fredrik participated at the conference pitches for Fusion 2020 in X'ian, with the permission of the ISIF board, to get more insights about the expectations and requirements of organising Fusion.

The TPC is selected based on the successful constellations that worked together in the TPC for Istanbul and Karlsruhe.

The local chairs from East Sweden Convention Bureau have extensive experience at organising small and large international conferences in the region.

We have chosen to have the same chairs for Tutorials and Special Sessions for the reasons that we want to add a couple of new focus areas to the Fusion conference. These focus areas are machine learning for information fusion, and autonomous systems, respectively, inspired by the WASP research program. This means that we plan to organise tutorials given by experienced researchers in the field (including WASP affiliates) and follow up with Special sessions (including invitation to a subset of the 250 WASP graduate students). Fredrik Heinz has participated in numerous Fusion conferences in the past, and is heavily involved in both the graduate study program and the AI research area of WASP. Karl Granström has participated in every fusion conference for the past ten years, and has given both Tutorials and proposed several Special Sessions.

The Awards Chairs are senior researchers with long experience from Fusion conferences, and they represent the sensor data fusion and the information fusion areas, respectively.

Zoran Sjanic has participated in many past Fusion conferences. He has a mixed position at LiU and SAAB and a large network with local companies and organisations, which make him an excellent candidate to coordinate the sponsor activities.










Venue Plan




Garden Lunch venue



ARE THERE ANY TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS OR SPECIAL VISA REQUIREMENTS?

Sweden is a signatory of the Schengen agreement and so travel between all other signatories of that agreement is open. Travel within Scandinavia is similarly open. As a member of the European Union, no visa is required for any other member nation. U.S.A., Canada and many other nations are also exempt from visa requirements for visits to Sweden under 3 months.


Letters of invitation will be provided to registered conference delegates who require one to speed the visa application process.

WHAT CURRENCY WOULD BE USED FOR THE CONFERENCE ACCOUNTING?

We have chosen to use SEK as conference currency.

ARE THERE ANY IMPORT/EXPORT RESTRICTIONS ON EQUIPMENT FOR THE EXHIBITIONS?

No special restrictions except regarding hazardous materials. If very expensive equipment is being brought in for demonstration purposes (with the intention to take it back again after the exhibition) then duty and tax on the equipment may have to be paid on arrival in Sweden. This is paid back when the equipment is removed again departure. This standard process is called ATA-Cané and will be handled by the participant's home country.



Official name: The Kingdom of Sweden

Capital: Stockholm

Form of government: Constitutional monarchy, parliamentary democracy

Sweden is the fourth-largest country in the European Union by area. Sweden has a total population of just over 10 million of which 2.3 million has a foreign background. It has a low population density of 22 inhabitants per square kilometre (57/sq mi); the highest concentration is in the southern half of the country. Approximately 85% of the population lives in urban areas.

Sweden is a constitutional monarchy and parliamentary democracy, with a monarch, Carl Gustav XVI, as head of state. The capital city is Stockholm, which is also the most populous city in the country. Legislative power is vested in the 349 member unicameral Riksdag. Executive power is exercised by the government chaired by the prime minister. Sweden is a unitary state, currently divided into 21 counties and 290 municipalities.

Sweden joined the European Union on 1 January 1995, but declined NATO membership, as well as Eurozone membership following a referendum. It is also a member of the United Nations, the Nordic Council, the Council of Europe, the World Trade Organization and the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD). Sweden maintains a Nordic social welfare system that provides universal health care and tertiary education for its citizens. Sweden ranks highly in numerous metrics of national performance, including quality of life, health, education, protection of civil liberties, economic competitiveness, equality, prosperity and human development.

WHEN TO GO AND WHAT TO PACK

The best time to visit Sweden is from May to September. June is the month with the longest days, with the midnight sun in the north and the white nights (midnight twilights) in the south, July is the warmest month.

In July the days can get warm so shorts, t-shirts should be on the packing list but also long pants, sweaters, a rain coat/umbrella. Swimwear for a refreshing swim in a lake or off one of the many islands in the Baltic sea.

Average daily hours of sunlight in July: 18 hours! Some clouds may however be present.

Yes, the winters can get quite cold and dark but on the flip side, in Sweden we are lucky to get four seasons and without them you wouldn't be able to experience ice driving or the ice hotel! Dark...absolutely but every place in the world gets the same amount of daylight, just distributed differently. Without the darkness you wouldn't expereince the magic of the sometimes everlasting light, even sunny, summer nights.

In Sweden we love to FIKA, enjoy a coffe and a cinnamon roll in a café. One of your first scent sensations when arriving in Sweden may well be that of coffee and cinnamon. While hanging at the café you may play Minecraft or Candy Crush while listening to Spotify or Skyping with a friend- all Swedish innovations.

Many Swedish women are tall and blonde but far from all. But you'll find them to be strong minded and independent.

Sweden has come far with gender equality. The parental leave law allows the father to stay home with the children longer than in any other country. Sweden has never finished lower that fifth in the Gender gap rankings by the World Economic Forum.

Sweden is far away, at least if you travel from places like Los Angeles, Sydney or Cape Town. But if you are travelling to Europe from any of those places- what isn't? But within Europe, Sweden is only a 2-3 hour flight from most places. Sweden itself is long, the size of California, and very diverse.

Space, now that is far away. In Sweden we believe that space tourism will take off from Lapland the land of reindeers, in northern Sweden in just a few years. Preparation and training for these trips have already begun at Spaceport Sweden-Europe's gateway to space and space travel.

IKEA revolutionized retail and how retailers operate...flat-pack furniture, assemble yourself, keep costs down, quality high, showcase the furniture and store layout in a way that gets you buying more of its producs than you initially intended. Yup!

There are many more inventions and much more to Sweden than this page has room to cover but perhaps you should come and explore them for yorself. Perhaps you'll have the company of a Wallander, Läckberg or the Millenium trilogy book as you make that flight or train ride over to this great country in the North. Where a lot gets done but we are shy to brag about.



DISCOVER ÖSTERGÖTLAND, EAST SWEDEN DAY TRIPS FROM LINKÖPING

GÖTA CANAL and BERG LOCKS

The canal is one of the biggest construction project in Swedish history. Construction of the 190 km long canal with 58 locks began in 1810 and was completed in 1832. Enjoy a ride on one of the beautiful canal boats, bike along it, and make sure to visit Berg where you'll see the Carl Johan's staircase with its seven connected locks and boats navigating their way through as they rise or are lowered 18,8 metres. Restaurants, museum, mini golf and the Cloetta candy factory outlet store. Berg is a 15 minute drive from downtown Linköping.

NORRKÖPING

30 minutes by highway or by commuter train you'll find yourself in this city once dominated by the paper and textile industry, giving it the nickname "the Manchester of Sweden" or Peking. With a population of 135 000 it's the 8th largest city in Sweden. The old industrial landscape has been transformed into the site for a congress centre, several museums, the Norrköping campus for Linköping University, hip apartments and a fashionable district for shopping and dining. Visit the Workers' Museum, Visualization Centre. Enjoy a beautiful walk along water falls in the old industrial landscape and along the Motala stream that runs through the city. A great way of exploring the city is by jumping on one of the yellow trams.

ARKÖSUNDS ARCHIPELAGO

About a 90 minute drive from downtown Linköping you will find yourself in the beautiful archipelago of the Baltic sea. Make a stop at the pier for an ice cream or freshly smoked fish, and watch the boats go by. You can rent kayaks or go ferry hopping between the islands of "Kopparholmarna". Bring your swim wear!

VADSTENA

Only 40 minutes by car from Linköping, sublimely situated beside Lake Vättern, Vadstena is a legacy of both church and state power, and today St Birgitta's abbey and Gustav Vasa's castle compete with each other for admiration. The atmosphere in the old town, with its wonderful cobbled lanes, intriguing small shops and wooden buildings.

OMBERG

The Omberg Ecopark is located on the eastern shore of Lake Vättern, less than an hour's drive from Linköping. Here you will be captivated by splendid orchids and enthralling myths. You can wander among old giant oak trees and shady beechwood forests, as well as enjoy the fantastic view from Hjässan – Omberg's highest point. Omberg has been turned into an ecopark in order to preserve and develop the natural values in the area. Enjoy a guided tour of the beautiful home of Ellen Key's "Strand" built in 1911, and breathe in the spectacular view.

ALVASTRA KLOSTER

This magical place of a cloister in ruins, just minutes away from Omberg, was founded by French Cistercian monks in 1143 and was during the middle ages the most powerful cloister in Sweden until it was abandoned after the Reformation around 1530. Here, the holy Birgitta lived for five years. Stones from the cloister were used to build the castle in Vadstena.

RÖKSTENEN

On your way to Tåkern or Omberg, make a stop in Rök and visit one of the most famous Nordic runestones. It features the longest known runic inscription in stone with 760 characters and is considered the first piece of written Swedish literature.

REJMYRE GLASSWORKS

has been producing beautiful glassware since 1810. Go on a guided tour through the fascinating world of glass and see it being produced from up close. Perhaps you'd like to give it a go? The tour ends up in the gift shop where there are always nice offers at factory prices. One hour's drive by highway from Linköping.



KOLMÅRDEN WILDLIFE PARK

A 50 minute drive from Linköping you can enjoy one of Scandinavia's most exciting experiences! Nestled in a beautiful countryside the park covers 1.5 square kilometres (370 acres) and is among the most popular tourist attractions in the Nordic countries. Home to 600 animals from all over the world, Kolmården offers activities for the entire family. In the Dolphin Show "Life", an international hit, dolphins leap from the water into the hearts of the audience. Board the Safari gondola, the only one of its kind in the world, to quietly glide close above lions and giraffes. Come face to face with big cats in Tiger World, and watch enthralled as raptors swoop overhead in the Birds of Prey Show "Wings". If you dare try a ride on Wildfire - the greatest wooden rollercoaster in the world. With three inversions, a top speed of over 110 km/h, a drop angle of 83 degrees and 12 airtime moments this ride is a real game changer!

ASTRID LINDGREN'S WORLD

Be there when Emil hoists Ida up the flagpole, play tag with Pippi Longstocking or explore Matt's Fort. In Astrid Lindgren's World you and your family become part of the classic children's stories, and the line between story and reality, and between theatre and play, becomes blurred. The park is full of imaginative play areas, and music and singing can be heard from our many stages throughout the day. 90 minute drive from Linköping.


GRÄNNA


Located on the south eastern shore of lake Vättern this picturesque town with cobblestone streets, gardens and beautiful colourful wooden houses is idyllic. Famous for its hard candy, visit one of the many factories and see how the hot melted sugar is turned into hard candy in a rainbow of colours and flavours. If you are interested in history the Andrée expedition exhibit is a must to visit, telling the story of the 1897 polar expedition.

VISINGSÖ.

While in Gränna take the short ferry ride over to this beautiful island. The island is best explored by horse and carriage, horseback, by foot or on a rented bike. Visit the castle ruin, Kumlaby church, the gardens of Wisingsborg, go kayaking or on a fishing excursion in the lake Vättern.









DISCOVER SWEDEN

Sweden, respectfully known as the Kingdom of Sweden is as varied as it is long with mountains in the north and rolling plains and sand dunes in the south, with deep forests and open coastal shore line and thousands of lakes. Rich in nature and culture, towns and cities all looking forward to your visit.

STOCKHOLM is truly one of the most beautiful capitals in the world. The city is built on 14 islands, with a well preserved medieval city center and lush parks. Learn about the tragic journey of the Vasa Ship who, sank on her maiden voyage in 1628, was raised from the sea in 1961 and today, almost restored to her former beauty, is berthed in Scandinavia's most popular museum, The Vasa Museum. Skansen is an open-air museum that provides insight into Sweden's heritage and natural history. Fotografiska is a museum dedicated to contemporary photography and Moderna Museet offers one of the world's finest collections of 20th and 21st century art. Take a swim in the city center or go boat hopping in the mesmerizing archipelago of 24 000 islands. The shopping is great, the restaurants are top class and there are hotels to suit every pocket book.

If Stockholm is the most beautiful city in Sweden, GOTHENBURG is said to be the most welcoming one, and a city where there is always something going on. Being an industrial seaport, Sweden's second city opens to the vast archipelago on the west coast, a unique maritime landscape, which is very accessible by boat. The city has an international reputation for its innovative cuisine, based on local products, specially fish and crustaceans from the North Atlantic. With over 25 museums, sport arenas, good shopping possibilities and a perfect mixture of old and new – this is definitely a city worth discovering.

MALMO, capital of the southern region Skane, was founded in the 11th century. Explore the medieval Malmohus Castle from the 14th century. Gaze up at he twisted apartment building Turning Torso, Malmo's landmark, by Spanish architect Calatrava. It is located in a new award-winning ecological housing area, The Western Harbour, built on the former industrial grounds of a shipyard. Malmo is a multicultural city where traditions of other cultures have been woven into old Scanian traditions. In magical summer evenings the sky and the sea blend into a radiant blue background to the graceful Oresund Bridge.

VISBY, on the island of GOTLAND, was a prominent member of the Hanseatic Union in the 12th and 13th century. The old medieval ramparts rather attract than keep visitors out these days and during the Medieval Week in August you can rub shoulders with knights in shining armor and try medieval gourmet fare. The entire southern part of the island of **OLAND** has been listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site due to its extraordinary biodiversity and prehistory. Discover some rare species of orchids and visit Tall John, a lighthouse where migrating birds flock on their journey to warmer destinations.

LAPLAND in the far north offers expansive wilderness, vibrant cities, white sandy beaches, the traditions of the Sami people and the first and original Ice Hotel.

DALECARLIA is probably the most Swedish region in Sweden. Come celebrate a traditional Midsummer, where you dance around the flower decked Maypole until early morning! Pick your own favorite wooden Dala Horse! Go on a beaver or moose safari! If you are the sporty type. measure your skills to that of 40 000 other cross-country skiers in the yearly Vasaloppet, based on the legendary King Gustav Vasa's escape in 1520, on skis, from the King of Denmark. In Mora you can visit the magnificent museum of the world famous artist Anders Zorn, who was frequently hired to portrait American presidents and high society members in Europe in the early 20th century. In Sundborn the former home of another Swedish painter, Carl Larsson, is guaranteed to charm your socks off. Music anyone? Dalhalla is a former limestone quarry, transformed into an outstanding open-air concert arena. Here you can enjoy world class performers and Swedish artists in the light summer nights.

SMALAND is the part of Sweden from which most of the 1.3 million Swedes that emigrated to North America between 1840 and 1930 originated. Today Smaland is home to IKEA, Pippi Longstocking and the Kingdom of Crystal. Here you can enjoy a close-up view of skilled glassblowers transforming the syrupy molten glass into beautiful work of art. Complete your day with a traditional "Hyttsill", hot-shop herring.
